Starch Paste Batik Materials

Wheat flour, Cassava, or Tapioca Water in a cup or bottle

Large soft brush or large feather

Cardboard Wax paper Masking Tape

Cold water textile dye or acrylic paint (thinned)

Starch Paste Batik-Technique

Adire Eleko is a traditional textile decorating technique from Nigeria.

This starch resist process uses a flour and water paste, applied with a chicken feather, brush or comb to create patterns and meaningful symbols on fabric. The resulting product resembles wax batik. On Tuesday we will mix the paste and apply it to the fabric. Thursday, after it has dried the pattern can be painted over with a cold water dye or thinned acrylic paint. When dry, the starch is washed out.

The decorated fabric can be used as a wall hanging or made into something useful like a small bag.
