

Class Needs for Week 2 Virtual KBIA Classes

Tennis

Tennis players will need to bring a racket, a ball of some sort (ideally a tennis ball, but any light ball should work!), and find a place to "play" outside that allows them to still see the screen!

Materials:

- Hole Punch and String (for when it dries)
- A smock to wear

Materials:

Materials:

- Cookie sheet

This simple Victorian toy was invented in the 19th Century and is an early form of animation. Two images on either side of a paper disc combine when the disc is twirled to form one image.
